PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:

Thank you to all of those who turned out to the Meet the Teacher Night/BBQ event last year. I am away in Vancouver this week but would like to share a few random thoughts.

First of all, thank you to all the volunteers-adults and students who helped with the Meet the Teacher Night.

Secondly, now is a good time to write about technology and safety: Thank you to those who have returned our Acceptable Use of Technology forms. This policy is there for a few reasons. One is to help foster online safety while at school and the other is to help keep the focus on learning. A policy of this nature is also a requirement for all schools in British Columbia.

For us as parents, it can be very difficult to navigate the online world and parenting because while the online world can offer so much good if used correctly, it also offers so much access to things that children wouldn't have seen when we were growing up.

Here are some safety tips to consider:

- -If your child is using an electronic device with access to the internet, ensure that they do it in a public place in your home such as your kitchen or living room where you as a parent can easily see what they are doing.
- -Avoid letting your children go in their rooms by themselves with technology.
- -If you have chosen to allow your child to have a phone, have them leave it charging overnight in the kitchen or somewhere other than their bedrooms.
- -Discuss with your children the importance of not giving out personal information or agreeing to meet someone they met online without talking to you first.
- -Cyber bullying is a thing: Encourage your children to be kind online and if they are being bullied or threatened to let you know right away.
- -Watch for changes in behavior such as being more withdrawn, reactive, or grades that are dropping ---basically any change in baseline behaviour. If you notice this, there may be many causes for that, but one thing to try is to start looking closely at their online lives.
- -Encourage your child to speak with you if they encounter anything online that concerns them or scares them. Try to be that safe place your child can go if they do run into trouble.
